SUEZ 18 MEET AGAIN.

Delegates arrive at Lancaster House for the second London Conference on the Suez Crisis - 18 nations who were in general agreement at the first conference. America's Secretary of State, Foster Dulles, supported by Britain's Foreign Secretary, Selwyn Lloyd, puts forward a scheme for the proposed Canal Users' Association. The scheme is welcomed by about half the delegates, and criticised by others, while some want to go straight to the United Nations. Mr. Dulles appeals for unity. No one wants to use force, he declares - but that is only one side of the problem. It is also important to achieve a just solution.

Meanwhile at Orly Airport, Paris, Suez pilots who have quit their jobs since Nasser took over arrive to report to the Canal Company's Paris headquarters. "We made our own decision, to leave" they say "without any pressure from outside. Under Nasser's military dictatorship, we had no confidence in the future".
