

WELSH REGIMENT MEMORIAL CHAPEL,

At the Cathedral Church of Llandaff, a Memorial Chapel is to be dedicated for the Welch Regiment, the 41st and 69th Regiment of Foot. The idea of the chapel was conceived by the late Colonel of the Regiment, Major-General D.P. Dickinson, who established a fund for the purpose in 1944. Since then, all ranks of the Welch Regiment, and its many friends have subscribed generously to make this day possible.

A wreath in the shape of the Regimental badge is laid at the chapel altar as past and present members of the unit, and their families enter the Cathedral for the service of dedication.

Civic leaders of the surrounding boroughs, with which the Welch Regiment has been linked for generations, also attend the service. Representing the Government is Major Gwilyn Lloyd George.

The Lord Mayor of Cardiff is greeted at the West Door of the Cathedral by the Dean and Major-General C.E.N. Lomax, Colonel of the Welch Regiment.
