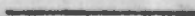

SHAPE-NATO.
September, 1956.

Students of the NATO Defence College in Paris visited the U.S. Air Force Base at Langstuhl, Germany, to witness an air powers demonstration. Members of the College were briefed on the Matador Guided Missile by a crew from the 69th Tactical Missile Squadron, 12th Air Force. Lieut.-General Clovis Byers, Commandant of the NATO Defence College, Rear Admiral Robert Cirier (French Navy) and other Members of the College were also briefed on various weapon- and equipment which were on display. The following day the College visited the Hohenfels training area in Western Germany to witness a parachute demonstration and a tactical jump by a reinforced company of the 188 Airborne Infantry Regiment and a heavy equipment drop by three C-119's. Present were Lt.-Gen. Byers (Commandant NATO Defence College); Lt.-Gen. Clarke (Commanding General 7th Army); Lt.-Gen. Uncles (Commanding General 77th Corps); Brig. Edward Estcourt (U.K. Army); Brig. Gen. Campbell (U.S. Army); Lt.-Gen. Bruce C. Campbell (U.S. Army Commander 7th Army); Rear Admiral Robert Cirier (Fr. N.); Member of NATO Defence College; Air Commodore S.J. Marchbank (R.A.F.); and Members of the College.

Following the tactical jump the College viewed a fire power demonstration of the weapons used by the 188th Airborne Infantry Regiment.
