POZNAN RIOT TRIAL.

In the Polish city of Poznan, the trial of youths who took part in the recent anti-government riots needs its end. Three of them are accused of murdering a policeman; they admit attacking him, but plead provocation. The defence claims the real instigators Western agents, have not been caught, and points out that these three were brought up in the bloody years of Nazi occupation; small wonder that they have little respect for authority. A strange feature of this affair is that the Polish government have confessed to violations of justice. Grievances, they say, were criminally exploited by the riots leaders; but they admit that the grievances were sound.
