POZNAN RIOT TRIAL

In the Polish city of Posnan, the trial of youths who took part in the recent anti-government riots nears its end. Three of them are accused of mardering a policeman; they admit attacking him, but plead provaction. The defence claims the real instigators Western agents, have not been complet, and points out that these three were brought up in the bloody years of Maxi occupation; small wonder that they have little respect for authority. A strange feature of this affair is that the Polish government have confessed to vollations of justice. Grievances, they say, were criminally exploited by the riots leaders; but they admit that the grievances were sound.
