BERLIN REPORT (32 m)

The Brandenburg Gate was a landmark of the capital of the German Reich. Situated at the end of the famous "Unter den Linden" it now marks the end of the British zone of Berlin. Since the Red Army took Berlin in 1945 the Red flag demonstrates the division of the town. The former famous "Quadriga" - a Roman Chariot with four horses, was destroyed and replaced by the symbol of the victorious Russians. Now it is planned to remould the quadriga in West Berlin, whilst the East Berlin administration would restore the gate. - - -

Grand Admiral Carl Dönitz, Second World War Commander in Chief of the German U-Boats, sentenced to 10 years prison by the International Tribunal of Nuremberg, was released from the Spandau Prison after 1 1/2 years of allied custody.

The former admiral had been proclaimed by Hitler as his successor. On the day after his release he received the Press in the garden of a friend's house before being flown out of Berlin and stated that he did not desire to speak.
