

FUR SHOW.

Nobody expects a fur coat to be cheap, but a London store demonstrates that it's possible to be smart at a price which doesn't even run into three figures. This leopard stencil beaver lamb sells at 50 guineas - for example, and so does this honey blonde creation by Jacques Griffe - also in beaver lamb.

On the left, blue-black seal; on the right, a sapphire beaver lamb three quarter coat - both with a half-belt at the back. The seal coat is slashed to the waist, while the other has inverted pleat sides.

This harlequin cape, with a pleated insertion of gay colours is in black kid, with a swirl collar of white mink.

And here's another cape, reversible this time; black beaver on the outside, and when you're tired of that, you turn it round to show a velvet spotted lining.

Very handy - you can change colouring with your mood, and all for the price of one. It's just as warm, either way!
