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THE WORLD'S FIRST INTERNATIONAL FUR COLLECTION Presented by Swears & Wells, SpotlightsDesigns From Six Countries.

The world's 1 rgest retail fur firm, Swears and Wells Ltd. have once ggain presented news in the field of fashion with the introduction of their International Fur Collection especially created for them by nine great designers from six countries. At a shown ng held in the Orchid Room of the Dorchester on United Nations Day, October 24th, Swears and Wells presented thirty or so of the most fashion wise silhouettes of the season highlighted with this specially created group of Beaver Lamb Coats by Jean Desses, Jacques Griffe, Madelsin de Rauch of Paris, Sybul Connolly of Dublin, Fontana of Rome, Simonetta of Rome, Pertegaz of Spain, and Pauline Trigere of the United States, and Walter Kerner of London. Entitled "Luxury on a Shoestring" the collection happily allied high fashion with low price tags and conclusively proved again that fashion is not a matter of "what it costs" but "how it looks" no matter the price tags.

The Internation Collection sparkled with new idless in design for that ever popular fur, Beaver Lamb. Used as Simonetta of Rom does it, it comes in sun splashed Capri blue in a short, very full sfter ski coat with drop sleeves accented by black; as Jaques Griffe of Paris handles it an easy going elegance is enhanced by the honey blonde colour with double back fullness and a kg slim line with double rows of golden but tons; as designer SybilConnolly of Dublin does it, it gains great sophistic on in velvety blackness in a beautifully cut coat with deep drop colk. Here in London Swears & Wells' own designer, Walter Kerner, gives still another look to Beaver Lamb when he uses a stencilled Leopard pattern for a slim line, collarless coat with great winged cape shovewhich give a new cachet of chic to this famous fur.

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From Madelaine de Rauch of Paris there is a math brown Beaver Lamb cut on a softer silhouette with her own casual touch of knitted jersey in a scarf and cuffs .. silver cuff links and buttons to accentuate them. Fontana of Rome chooses aRoman blue for her young silhouette with its double fur collar of fur and velvet.. its luxury touch on a fur of little price. Jean Desses uses another version of Embros Lamb in silvery grey for a slimmed-down, slightly higher waisted coat with an Empire fee lng. From the United States, and believed to be the first times any American designer has been invited to present a design in an International Collection, famous Pauline Trigere creates a coat cut on the diagnol with the side split accentuated by giannt harlequin buttons. Platinum grey Beaver Lamb is sued for a comparatively simple coat by Pertegaz of Madrid and another group of highly styled imaginatively handled mouton lamb coats, complete this phase of the fashion presentation.

High fashion is very much a part of the story always at Swears & Wells where designer Walter Kerner holds forth. For fun, there is a barrelcoat of white source, there's a Pierrot cape of black kidskin cut like a poncho and highlighted with a fluffy little roll collar and bow of white musquash, so pretty you'd swear it was white mink... there's a blousedbackPersim lamb cape with a petal like collar of silver blue mink—there's one of the prettiest coats in the collection made & shaded embros lamb cut slim and narrow with an easy bloused back, and

shirtwaist effect. Swears and Wells not only believe in giving you a lot for the money in mouton, but they are perfectionists in mink too and they show a range of Royal Pastel Ranch and Lutetia minks designed with distinction and authority.

It takes a good deal of forethought and imagination to plan and arrange for this type of International collection.

While fabric firms and some others have presented designs from various coutures under one label, this is the first time in the world that any furrier has ever visualised fashion on an international scale. Swears and Wells have done this and their International collection, sparked by their own brilliant designing staff, is the to be applauded

Accessories for the International Show at the Dorchester include gowns by Frederick Starke, sportswear by Dorville, hats by Simone Mirman and Jewellery by Paris House.

Rosemary Sheehan, who is an International Fur Stylist, was commissioned by Swears and Wells to coordinate this Inte national Fur collection and has flown to London for this presentation.

This entire show will be presented in Canada where Swears and Wells have many stores, and inthe United States where they are also large fur retailers.

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
