Representatives of the press were invited on the 4ht. of
November by the Israeli army to a press conference at which were
present the two Egyptian generals made prisoners in the Gaza border.
The two generals are General Youssef Abdullah El Agroudi, (seated on
the left?, the Commander of the Eighth Division, and General Mohammed
Fouad Al Digwi, former military commander of the Gaza strip.

General El Agroudi, who studied at the Sandhurst Military Academy, in Great Britain, explained that the radio being out of use, and without the aid of the aviation and the tanks, he had done all he could at the moment when his position had been invaded by the Israeli infantry after violent bombing both byair and on the ground.

The second part of the film gives several views of battlefields, dead Egyptian soldiers and weapons left behind by the Egyptians.

Description of cut subject: "ISRAELI TROOPS AT GAZA OUTSKIRTS AND IN THE SINAI

Under the guidance of Istaelian officers attached to the Press Services, three cars transporting journalists, camermen and photographers left Tel Aviv on the third of November to go to the Sinai Desert where Every where the representatives of the battles raged a few days ago. press found proofs of the Egyptian collapse. The saw freshly dug graves and scattered around them burnt tanks and various vehicles, and automatic weapons.

It was on the El Arish road that this cemetery of war material was the most impressive: British howitzers, 105mm. American guns, Soviet cannons, all in perfect working condition . Many of the artillery pieces had not even been fired.

The most striking detail was the extraordinary quantity of shoes which had been left behind by the Egyptians. They run faster without shoes" assure the Israelis.

The units of the Israeli army which the journalists were able to see hardly resembled the classic image of war units. More than an army called up from the nation, it was the nation in arms.

The film was taken for the first half in the Sinai desert, and for the second, in the Gaza outskirts. Infantry forces are seen, formed mainly of border settlers, advancing towards Gaza.
