

THE CYCLE SHOW.

Manufacturers have worked round the clock to produce their latest models for the Cycle and Motor Cycle Show at Earls Court. The last till 1958. Here's an Ariel 600 cc, out away to show the works.

Among the pedal cycles, the Philips Titanium, with its simplified but strong frame, weighs only 14 pounds 3 ounces.

And here's the streamlined Triumph on which Johnny Allen gained the world motor-cycle speed record of 214.4 miles an hour. But it's the scooters, like this French Terrot, which attract most interest - heightened, no doubt, by the threat of petrol rationing. After all, ordinary pedal cycling is so tiring!

There are fewer sightseers than usual at the show - partly because a strike delayed the opening - but exhibitors report that there are more buyers than ever - particularly from overseas - a very healthy sign!
