New York fireboats rush to battle with a large blase on the Brooklyn waterfrent, pouring thousands of tens of waters a minute into the inferme while tags brave the flames to heal merchant ships to safety. The initial fire expleded 4,000 tons of inflameble carge on the city's largest pier, shattering windows as far as five miles away.
