At the Pavilion, Bath, Hungarian refugees from nearby Thornypits Camp put on a variety show in aid of British refugees evicted from Egypt by Nasser. This well-timed inspiration receives enthusiastic local support; the Mayor of Bath is present to honour the occasion. The refugees call their show "Hungarian Rhapsody"; they are nearly all amateurs, but they've worked very hard to make it a success - and it gets across in a big way.

By their generous thought, these homeless ones have shown two things - their gratitude to the people of Britain who gave them sanctuary in their most desperate hours, and their understanding that in this troubled time they are not the only ones who have lost their homes and their livelihood.

Twenty-five miles away, at Stonehouse Camp, are those other refugees the Hungarians want to help - British citizens thrown out of Egypt as a reprisal against Britain's action in the Canal Zone. Many of them had lived in Egypt all their lives, as shopkeepers or small businessmen - proud of their British citizenship, whether old or young, but having no quarrel with the country where they lived and worked. That did not save them. Innocent of any crime these families have lost their homes, their businesses - everything but what they could carry in a suitcase.

With the world full of refugees of many nationalities - asking our help, we must not forget to do our best for these - our own....
