2.20 PM BIGGEST U.S. BOMBER HERE

AMERICA'S BIGGEST AND NEWEST BOMBER, THE B 52 STRATO-FORTRESS, CAPABLE OF CARRYING THE HYDROGEN BOMB, LANDED AT THE R.A.F. STATION AT BRIZE NORTON, OXFORDSHIRE, SOON AFTER MIDDAY TODAY, AFTER A NON-STOP FLIGHT FROM ITS BASE IN CALIFORNIA.

A SPOKESMAN OF THE SEVENTH AIR DIVISION OF THE UNITED STATES AIR FORCE SAID THAT THE GIAN EIGHT-JET-ENGINEED BOMBER, WITH A SPEED OF 650 M.P.H. AND A RANGE OF 6,000 MILES, WAS ON A ROUTINE TRAINING MISSION AND WOULD BE STAYING IN THIS COUNTRY A FEW DAYS BEFORE RETURNING TO AMERICA.
