## BOY RESCUED.

All Australia holds its breath as volunteer mineworkers labour round the clock to rescue two-year-old Graham Davis from a borehole at Mandarah, near Purth. Vacuum cleaners are brought to help draw out the stale air and keep the bey alive.

Graham's father calls down to him: "It's all right, son - you'll be safe - yes'll be out soon". Faintly the minors can hear the boy crying.

At last they're through - they reached the borchole - and a ladder is lowered into the shaft for the miners to bring up their precious load. Gentley, from hand to hand, Graham is pessed to the surface - bruised, dirty, shivering with cold - but alive.

On the board stretcher, little Graham reaches the waiting ambulance men - his plife saved after 24, dreadful hours which held a mation in suspense.
