## FLOODS RIP KENTUCKYL

Disastrous winter floods spread death and destruction through four southeastern states. These scenesin Barbourville, Kentucky, mirror conditions throughout much of the state, as well as in Virginia, West Viriginia and Tennessee. Thousands are left homeless by the swirling waters. Barbourville alone reported 70% of the community inundated.

Damage in the stricken states is estimated in the millions of dollars. And at leastten persons have died. But even as the high point of the flood passes, leaving this watery waste in its wake, the weathe bureau warns of new rains and fresh destruction.
