The Britan nia steamed up River Gambia and H.R.H. went ashore at Sankia, where he attended a Conference of 34 Chiefs. He met each one individually, received an address of Royal Welcome (through an interpretor) and responded. Afterwards he went through Sankia Village and witnessed village activity.

H.R.H. then saw a rice ploughing exhibition on his way to Sankia Wharf. He then landed at Ballingho. The natives fired a salute with homemade rifles. From there to the village of Illiasa to meet Chief Tamba Jammeh and walk round his village and meet his wives and family. He then proceeded to a Wharf called Katchang Janda, where he proceeded by outboard cahoe down a creek to some ricefields. Here all the womenfolk were harvesting the rice and chanting a song about the Royal Duke. On the way back down river to rejoin the (?) the Duke shot two more crocodiles.
