NEW ARCHBISHOP ENTHRONED:

The Nost Reverend Dr. William Bodfrey walks in procession up the aisle of Westminster Cathedral to be enthroned as the seventh Roman Cathelic Archbishep of Westminster - a position which has been vacant since the death of that greatly-loved figure, Cardinal Griffin, in August last year.

The congregation and the Archbishop kneel together in proyer, asking God's bleasing on his new task as leader of over 3 million British Catholics.

The climax of the 500-year-old coremony approaches, as Archhishop Godfrey takes his place on the vestment chair,

The white Lawn surceat, the surplice, the cope and mitre, the golden ereak, are brought by four small charisters. The vesting is performed by Arabbishop Gerald O'Mera, Apostalic Delegate to Great Britain a post which Arabbishop Gedfrey himself held, when in 1938 he was appointed the first Papel Envoy in this country for nearly 400 years. The vesting completed, the Apostolic Delegate leads the new Arabbishop to his throne.

In his splendid robes of his high office, the Arabbishop of Westminster receives the hounge of his follows. Few men could be better suited for his position than Dr. Godfrey; former rector of the English College in Rome, former Apostolic Delegate, former Arabbishop of the big Catholic community in Idverpeel. A great responsibility is his - but he is well equipped to face it.
