

THE QUEEN AND DUKE AT HARROW:

Harrow School, founded in the reign of Queen Elizabeth the First, is honoured by a visit from Queen Elizabeth the Second and her husband. She is the first monarch to visit the school since George the Fifth, 45 years ago. At the school entrance, the Queen is met by the headmaster, Dr. Robert James, who leads her through the Yard, which for two centuries was the school's only playground.

Her Majesty mounts the steps for the ceremony of "Bill", one of Harrow's oldest traditions. It is a call-over of all the boys in the school, held on half-holidays in the summer and on special occasions.

In the Speech Room, the Queen sees the arms of the seven Old Harrovian Prime Ministers, and the banners of nine Old Harrovian V.C.'s. Then the school sings one of Harrow's best-loved songs - with a new verse written for the occasion.

And now - three cheers for Queen Elizabeth!

The formal welcome over, the Queen and the Duke leave the speech room for the tour of the school. Boys are as quick at guessing as anybody, so the big question at Harrow now is: "Will Prince Charles be coming here?"
