A quick flight from the nation's capitol brings President Eisenhower to Norfolk, Virginia, to begin a leisurely cruise to Bermuda. The Chief Executive is trying to shake an obstinate head cold and cough.

At the Norfolk stopover, the President confers with and pays tribute to the eight-nation members of the Atlantic Naval Command of NATO.

From this meeting, President Eisenhower, carrying the burdens of the free world, travels to the West Indies and an important first conference with Prime Minister MacMillan of Britain.
