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MONACO GRAND PRIX

Positive developed: 107 meters - 355 ft

World Champion Juan Manuel FANGIO of Argentina sped to victory in his Maserati in the Monaco Grand Prix yesterday after three top British drivers were involved in an early accident.

Tony BROOKS, Britain in a Vanwall was second and third was Masten Gregory of Kansas City in a Maserati.

Only six cars finished the race out of 16 starters,

Fangio had held the lead since a spectacular three-car accident eliminated his top competitors. None was injured. The accident came on the fourth lap when STIRLING MOSS in a VANWALL slapped into a retaining wall. Moss was leading at the time. Behind him closely were MIKE HANTHORN in a Ferrari and PETER COLLINS in another Ferrari. They hit the wall in efforts to keep clear of Moss. None of the three were injured.

Fangio's time was three hours ten minutes and 12.8 seconds for the 106 ~~kilometers~~ laps which amounted to 330.225 kilometers (205.07 miles). He averaged 104.16 kilometers per hour (64.68 m.p.h.)
