

HOUSE OF TOMORROW:

Eighteenth and twentieth centuries meet in a new house at Blackheath. The Georgian concept of a terraced house is adapted to meet the requirements and tempo of today. Thermostatically-controlled central heating is one of the features making for an easy-to-run home. The ground floor is divided into sections by glass panelling; one of the sections is a patio - a sheltered garden right in the house.

The main bedroom is on the first floor, with a built-in wardrobe unit and dressing room. The second floor houses the children's bedroom; both floors have their own bathrooms, and there's a spare room as well.

The ground floor is a housewife's dream. The dining room can be separated off - but it's within easy reach of the kitchen.

For entertaining, the whole ground floor can be thrown open - living room, kitchen, dining room, study and patio. And although there's so much glass, the house is warm in winter and cool and airy in summer. If this is the home of tomorrow - roll on tomorrow!
