HOUSE OF TOMORROW:

Righteenth and twentieth conturies meet in a new house at Blackheath. The Georgian concept of a terraced house is adapted to meet the requirements and tempo of teday.

Thermostatically-controlled control heating is one of the features making for an easy-to-run home. The ground floor is divided into sections by glass panelling; one of the sections is a patie - a sheltered garden right in the house.

The main bedroom is on the first fleer, with a builtin wardrobe unit and dressing room. The second fleer houses the children's bedroom; both fleers have their own bathrooms, and there's a spare room as well.

The ground floor is a housewife's dream. The diming room can be separated off - but it's within easy reach of the kitchen.

For entertaining, the whole ground floor can be thrown open - living room, kitchen, diming room, study and patie. And although there's so much glass, the house is warm in winter and cool and airy in summer. If this is the home of tomorrow - roll on temorrow!
