

In the British Games at the White City, the International 880 soon develops into an Anglo-German battle, but it's the British who force the pace. Brian Hewson takes the lead, with Michael Rawson holding close to him; but East Germany's Hans Reinnagel is waiting his chance not far behind. And now it's Leslie Lock at the head, with Hewson chasing him, followed by Veals and Paterson.

And here's the German challenge - Reinnagel pounding after Hewson with only a hundred yards to go! But he's left it too late - he just can't overtake him - the British boy's holding him off! Yes, the German's defeated - and Brian Hewson races home in 1 minute 49.8 seconds - only 1.2 seconds outside his own British record!

Now for the international mile - which includes Richtzenhain of Germany who beat Pirie at Melbourne. Right from the start, the German leads; but lying third is Derek Ebbotson, No 7, hiding his time as he has so often - and so successfully - done before. And at just the right moment he puts on the pressure!

With every yard, Ebbotson's gaining on the German.

Richtzenhain has used all his reserve and Ebbotson is hurtling himself ahead, streaking for the tape in a brilliant sprint finish. The German's three and a half seconds behind, and it's yet another victory for Britain!
