BOMB EXPLODES IN ALGIERS CASINO
Positive developed: 71 meters - 240 ft

Terrrorists made another killing in a particularly ugly expedition when a bomb was hidden in a Casino, Casino Saint Eugene in Algiers, and exploded while young people, both europeans and arabs were dancing and spending a leizurly evening in the Casino.

Ten people were killed and 50 severely injured, several had to be amputated. Among the victims are the orchestra leader Lucian Semer and a young girl singer of his orchestra.

This picture shows the aftermath of this dramatic explosion, the demolished installations and orchestra platform, and hole made by the exploding bomb which was hidden under the stage.

Ugly remains and blood marks are still on the spot, shots of the Hospital and several among the wounded, lying in their beds. This is MUSTAPHA HOSPITAL in Algiers.
