BRITAIN SWEEPS THE BOARD AT LE MANS.

The Le Mans 24-hour sports car race is a real battle of nations this year - and Italy and Britain are expected to provide most of the excitement. The factory teams of Ferrari and Maserati are a powerful force; main British hope lies with the Jaguars, all privately owned. Last year was a Jaguar wistory for Flockhart and Sanderson - and they're both driving today, in separate Jaguars.

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There's Stirling Noss's Maserati, No.1., battling with a Ferreri - and the leading Jaguar, driven by Ron Floobhart, last year's winner, and Iver Bueb, winner in '55.

Temy Brooks' Asten-Martin comes to grief, but no eme's seriously injured. Mike Hawthorn drives Ferrari No.7. In the small car classes, the British Lotus team is doing fine. Throughout the night the gruelling laps mount up - there's Flockhart's Jaguar, now well in the lead. Where's the great Italian challenge? One by one the Farraris and Maseratis have been dropping out - in spite of all the resources of their big favtory organizations - and it's the British cars which are proving their stamina! Hore stamina, in fact, than some of the spectators.

Dawn is beginning to break - and epen-air Mass in the trackside woods reminds us that this is Sunday. But there's no rest for the weary drivers - least of all the winning Jaguars, first and second by the Scottish team Houire Hoosse. Winners Flockhart and Bueb head a fantastic list - Jaguars first, second, third, fourth, and sixth; ten British cars in the first twelve; and class victories for Lotus, and Aston-Martin. One of the biggest national triumphs in car rasing history!
