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ROYAL WEDDING OF PRINCE HENRI OF FRANCE

All Europe's surviving royalty and nobility flowed into Paris for the wedding to-day of a young man of 24 and a girl of 22 who between them are related to nearly everyone listed in the Almanach de Gotha. He is Prince Henri of France, son of the Comte de Paris pretender to the French throne and the Comtesse de Paris. She is Duchess Marie-Thérèse of Wurttemberg, daughter of Duke Philip of Wurttemberg and Archduchess Rosa of Hapsburg.

More than 3,000 guests are invited, among all the most brilliant names of Europe are King Paul and Queen Frederika of Greece with their 18-year old daughter, Sophie. Queen Victoria of Spain, the widow of King Alfonso XI former King Simeon of Bulgaria; the Count of Barcelona, pretender to the throne of Spain; Grand Duke Jean of Luxembourg, the Princesses Beatrix and Irene of the Netherlands and several dukes and duchesses from Bavaria, Saxony, Yugoslavia, Denmark, Hanover and Liechtenstein.

A civil ceremony at Dreux Town Hall was followed by a nuptial mass near by in the royal chapel of Saint Louis, where are buried the bridegroom's ancestors. The chapel can accommodate only about 300 of the 3,000 invited guests, including King Paul and Queen Frederika of Greece. A long pavilion has been rushed to completion last night in front of the chapel to shelter the overflow.

A mammoth lunch-buffet was served in a red and white tent in the park behind the chapel after the noon-wedding. Afterwards the park gates were thrown open to an estimated 10,000 visitors.
