RITES FOR AGA KHANS

To the Aga Khan's villa between Egypt's Nile and the dedort, come his French-born widow, the Bogum, and his heir, the 20-year-old Harvard undergraduate, now Aga Khan the Fourth. The old Aga dead at 79, is mourned in rites at the villa near Aswan. In Moslam fashion, shoes are removed by the mourners before entering.

The heat, which makes headlines in other, distant lands, also besets Aswan. The temperature climbs to 115 degrees during the funeral rites. The Ismaili faithful tally their prayers with praying beads, as the 45-minute service draws to a close.

The procession is to the villa's courtyard - where the grieving Begum, and the young Aga, see the body placed in a temperary brick temb. Later, it will be removed to a permanent mausoleum on a hilltop of ancient Egypt.
