## INTERVIEW WITH RAMPTON:

W. SYMON: ARE YOU SURE THERE'S NOBODY HERE THAT SHOULDN'T BE HERE ?

ANSWER: I AM SURE THERE ARE NO PATIENTS DETAINED AT RAMPTON WHOSE CONDITION DOES NOT WARRANT IT, BECAUSE IT'S OUR DUTY CONSTANTLY TO REVIEW CASES IN ORDER TO DETERMINE WHETHER THEY ARE SUITABLE FOR DISCHARGE OR NOT:

W. SYMON: HAVE YOU ANY COMMENT TO MAKE SIR ON THE RECENT PRESS CRITICISMS ?

ANSWER: YES. I THINK THEY HAVE BEEN VERY UNFAIR. ON THE OTHER HAND THAT CRITICISM MAY HAVE BEEN DUE TO THE IGNORANCE OF THE SET-UP OF RAMPTON. THERE IS CONCEPTION THAT RAMPTON IS A PRISON - IT IS NOT. IT'S A MENTAL HOSPITAL...
