IT'S ANIMAL
COUNTIN' TIME!

At Banff National Park, Canada's scenic wonderland, the animal population is having its census taken. Game Wardens are making the yearly count of all the wild life in the famous park. Here's a family of Big Horn sheep; sure footed climbers of the rocky peaks.

A mother black bear has a couple of baby cubs to add to this year's list.

A coyote pup is pulled from his den - another now nose to be counted. It's a thorough survey, and few manage to hide out - deer are one of the major groups.

The check gives an accurate estimate of the animals in the park and the food available. The new additions to a buffalo herd may be a problem on the winter grazing range. There are elk and moose and many others there to be counted. But taking the census in Banff Park is a happy job.
