MALAYA PREPARES FOR INDEPENDENCE:

Enels Lasgue, federal espital of Malays, prepares for a celebration - the day of Merderka, which means Independence. Public Buildings in the city are having a wash and brush up for the day when Malays becomes a free and equal partner in the British Commonwealth of Nations. High Commissioner Sir Donald MacGillivrey, and Sir Abdul Rahman, future head of State, attend the coronomy in Fing's House where the independence agreement is signed. The rulers of all the federated States are here too.

Old ties are being broken, Sir Donald declares, but now ties of respect and mutual trust are already there to take their place.

Under the new regime, one man will continue his job as before the British soldier. For eight years he has borne the brunt of the compaign
against the Communist jungle-fighters - and the rulers of the new Malaya know
that without his aid the terrorists could not be controlled. So he will stay as part of a united command of British and Malayan units - to help defend the
newly-wen independence of our Commonwealth partner,
