RESCUE DRAMA  
IN RHODE ISLAND!

A little girl lost - lost for 20 hours, then found - wedged in an eight-inch space between two buildings. The incredible plight of 3-year-old Eileen Fahy brings feverish rescue effort by firemen and other workers at Providence, Rhode Island. Firmly, and yet tenderly, the rescuers punch a hole in foot-thick cinder blocks. Little Eileen, who apparently was chasing a kitten when she squeezed between the walls, is whimpering and motionless as we see her arm revealed. There's hope now she can be removed alive. The digging continues - Eileen's ordeal is endured by all on the scene. More of the little body comes into view - hearts beat faster, the rescue drama builds.

Now the blonde head, as though poking through and pleading to be seen. Anxious hands claw at the blocks which still hold Eileen prisoner.

At last! After 90 minutes of digging, Eileen is taken out alive. A sigh of relief goes out while the child is removed for a hospital check-up. Tears stain a dirty face as Eileen is comforted by her father.

This is the wall where a child was imprisoned for more than 20 hours - and this is the child, happily alive. She made headlines across the nation. And all of us can imagine our own little ones - all the little Eileens who innocently make hair turn grey.
