MORE RECORDS FOR STIRLING.

On the Salt Flats at Bonneville, Utah, Stirling Moss prepares to drive faster than he's ever done before. In a specially-designed M.G., he's tackling several of the Class F International records, for cars up to one and a half litres. The little car's tailor-made to fit Stirling's figure; he almost lies down in it, for the Roaring Raindrop - as its makers call it - is fifteen feet long and only three feet high.

First, a warming-up run across the famous flats, which are like a huge billiard-table made of salt - an ideal surface for record-breaking. And one by one the world records tumble; one kilometer, one mile, five kilometres, five miles, ten kilometres - top speed is 246.64 miles per hour.

Five world records in one day, by a British driver in a British car - and they stay in the family, for all the former records were held by M.Gs.
