Nine months ago Graham White was caught in a muckspreading machine. He was terribly injured, but managed to stop the machine by jamming his head against the wheel. Both legs had to be amputated. Within a week he was walking without crutches; and already he's back at work, operating a combine harvester, on the very farm where he met with his accident - at Linalade, Bedfordshire.
