

Cleaning out muckthrower - pulled him in by his clothing - 50 h.p. machine; knew he must stop the machine or he'd come out mangled, so jammed his head in wheel and stalled it. One spike pierced him below eye, another broke jaw, and legs were mangled. Waited an hour for help. All clothes ripped off except tie and one shirt sleeve.

Hospital for three months. Within a week of getting tin legs was walking without crutches. Only on them 11 weeks now.
