POLAND V. BRITAIN ATHLETICS:

British girls are the heroines of the hour in the Poland v. Britain athletics contest at Warsaw. Here's Carol Quinton rumping home in the 90 metres hurdles, with Caroline Ivins close behind.

And in the 100 metres, 17-year-old Madeleine Weston streaks ahead from the start, while Pam Wyatt battles with the two Poles for second place.

Nice work! Now for the 200 metres - June Paul on the inside; she took part at short notice - but she's quite unruffled.

Into the straight - and June's pulling steadily ahead! She clocks 24.4 seconds - a new British native record which helps to clinch the British women's overall victory by 57 points 60 49.

Mike Ellis also breaks a British record with a fine throw of nearly 212 feet - but the 5,000 metres is the most spectacular men's event, Gordon Pirie leaves the pacing to his pupil Laurie Reed for the first few laps. Then the Poles "Krzyszowskiak and Zimny take up the lead. Pirie, in the rear, bides his time.

And here it comes - the crowd's on its feet as the two Poles are left far behind! With incredible ease, Gordon Pirie strides ahead as though he'd only just started!

No bother at all - he almost walks over the line!

Gordon's victory can't prevent a narrow defeat for the British team - but Warsaw like London, has taken him to its heart!
