BRITISH M.P.s IN RHODESIA.

Seven British M.P.s from both parties are greeted by the drums of the Barotse people as they call on the Paramount Chief Mwanawine the Third. Mr. Richard Wood, M.P. for Bridlington leads the delegation to visit this outlying Rhodesian tribe, which is part of the Federation but whose Chief owes allegiance direct to the Queen.

In Lusaka, capital of Northern Rhodesia, the M.P.s inspect the Hodgson Technical Training College. For although the African's life is still rooted in his ancient tribe, the young men are eager to learn new skills; for craftsmen are urgently needed by the rapidly-growing industries that are transforming their land. Old ways are giving place to new in the young and vigorous Federation of Rhodesia and Nyasaland.
