

**FIRST U.S. VISIT BY  
MOROCCAN MONARCH!**

Aboard a Military Air Transport Constellation, a pro-Western leader, King Mohammed the Fifth of Morocco, arrives in Washington for an important state visit. At the airport personally to greet the Arab ruler is President Eisenhower, to tell him he hopes the trip results in strengthening relations between the two countries.

Arriving at the residence for Presidential guests, the Chief Executive escorts the King to the door before returning to the White House across Pennsylvania Avenue. By nightfall, it is announced the President would be unable to attend the state dinner for his Moroccan guest.
