STATE OPENING OF PARLIAMENT:

Parliament opens on Guy Fankes' Day - but the only threat to the ancient corumony Somes from the rain - and even that stops just in time. Princess Margaret, the Duke and Ducheas of Gloucester, the Princess Royal and the Ducheas of Kent arrive before the Queen and Prince Philip. For Mr. Harold Macmillan, this is the first State Opening of Parliament since he became Prime Minister.

57/90.

The Royal Procession comes down Whitehall, with a Sovereign's Escort of the Household Cavalry. The Queen rides in the Irish Coech; with her is Prince Philip, wearing the full dress uniform of an Admiral of the Fleet.

Guy Fankes may have been dead for three and half centuries, but the cellars of the House have, in accordance with tradition, been formally searched before the Sovereign arrives. The Queen and her husband give a special wave to several hundred beys of Westminster Schöol waiting at the entrance. One of the world's youngest monarchs - one of the world's oldest Parliaments - and a coromony that never loses its appeal.
