Porty-seven roofless houses - a grim spectacle for the people of Hasel Grove, in Hatfield New Town, after a gale-swept night. Fierce winds raging through Southern England have left a trail of havor - but none so bad as here. Without warming, the light aluminium roofs were torn away - and forty-seven femilies are homesless.

As always, diseaster brings out the best in people - and help, both official and unefficial, is quickly fortheoming. Neighbours find space for the victims; but local gainion - led by their N.P., Lord Balmiel - demands an impairy into the design and craftsmanship of these post-war houses - which failed to withstand the force of an English storm.
