

SCOTLAND V. WALES:

Scotland meet Wales at Hampden Park - and the Scots have their eyes on the World Cup, so the 43,000 crowd are hoping for fireworks. But from the kick-off, Wales (in the striped shorts) prove they're a tougher nut to crack than the Swiss.
