

NON-STOP TO BUENOS AIRES:

Six B-52 Stratofortresses of America's Strategic Air Command set out on a record-breaking hop - from a United States airfield to Buenos Aires - and back, 10,600 miles non-stop! They want to remind the world that even in this missile age, the bomber is far from finished. The giant jet bombers cross the South American coastline, sweeping over Venezuela at more than 500 miles an hour, steadily onwards to Brazil and Bolivia.

And now - Buenos Aires, the Argentine capital, where they're holding an Aeronautics Week. But the visitors don't touch down - tanker planes refuel them for the homeward run; a manoeuvre that calls for very skilful flying.

It's the first time such a group has made a flight of this type, but they all complete their record trip - less than 24 hours to Buenos Aires and back!
