BOURGUIBA CONFERS IN MOROCCO

Bonkthandeveloped: 47 meters = 157 ft

President Habib Bourguiba of Tunisia arrived November 20, on Rabat-Salé airport for a conference with King Mohammed V of Morocco. The monarch will leave in a few days for the United States.

The Sultan, Mohammed V welcomed personnally President Habib Bourguiba who landed at Rabat airport for a two-day visit. Mr.Bourguiba wearing a red fee but wearing otherwise a formal Western cutaway, spread his arms wide to embrace the King, who walked on the field to meet him.

Behind the King stood the Royal Guards, negro troops of central Africa who have been the traditional defenders of Morocco's rubers for generations. French officers in sky blue caps commanded the guards, just as they did before Morocco gained full independence two years ago.

Mr. Bourguibs is confering with the King to study a means of mediation in the Algerian rebellion against France.

After the formal arrival and greeting cememony Mr.Bourguiba ans his retenue drive to Prince Moulay Hassan's somptuous Villa at the Soussi where he will stay during his two-day visit in Rabat.

Later in the afternoon, Mr.Bourguiba is receibed at the Royal Palace by King Mohammed V where they have a first conference.
