Amongst others we understand that there will be present Mr. Goronwy Roberts M.P., and Mr. Tom Jones North Wales TUC Secretary, and the organisers are hoping to be able to arrange speeches by well known national figures.

This event has received considerable publicity in the North Wales provincial newspapers and further information can be had from the aditor of the Caernarvon and Denbigh Herald, Caernarvon, N. Wales, or from organisers "The Nantle Valley and District Unemployed Workers Committee" at Bod Diddan, High Street, Penygroes, Caerns. Whilst your newsreal editor may not consider that coverage in excess of 1 minute would be justified in the newsreels for national circulation, we would be most anxious to show a print of the entire footage which your camera man may shoot should you decide to cover this event, and would be pleased to discuss special terms to that end.

Four hundred unemployed persons fr the Nantlle Valley in Caernarvonshire who are arranging a seven mile march fr Penygroes to Caernarvon on Saturday, February 1, in order to draw attention to their plight, are to be joined by hundreds of other protest marchers fr various centres in the County, where unemployment is high.

Latest figures reveal that there are 3, 013 men and women in Caernarvonshire on the dole. The percentage o insured persons out o work is

Heading the procession will be three brass bands, and marching with the unemployed milt and their families will be local Councillors, ministers of religion, school teachers, tradesmen and even school children.

At Caernarvon a demonstration meeting will be held. There the

the Borough Council are allowing them to use the Town Pavilion wh holds abt 8,000 people.

At Penygroes members of the Nantlle Valley Unemployed Cttee and their friends are busy these days making banners and sloganse the state of the state

Last week Mr D V P Lewis, the newly appointed Minister of State for Wales, visited Penygroes kaxs at the invitation o t Unemployed Cttee to see conditions at first hand.

Mr Lewis was told o t decline in t slate quarrying industry in t Valley since 1920. Btn 1920 and 1924 there were abt a dozen quarries employing 1300 men. By 1957 there were only three quarries. wh employed btn them 350 men. This was an overall reducation o 300 per cent now employed in t industry as compared with is 1920. The slate industry haxbana t basic industry and efforts are bg made to get new industry into t area.

The Minister, however, had one piece o hopeful new for them for he announced that tenders had be invited for a new factory, a Manchester firm propose to build in Penygroes, and who will explay 160-mostly men.
