

SCOTLAND V. WALLABIES:

The Wallabies (playing in dark shirts) kicked off against Scotland at Murrayfield fervently hoping that the last International in Britain would bring them victory. And what a brave start they made. Their right wing J.L. Donald scored a try right over in the far corner.

From that tremendous distance, 19-year-old Lenahan converted. Australia 5 points - Scotland nil. That didn't worry the Scots. The Australians had scored first against England, Wales, and Ireland and still love to all three. And now it was Scotland on the attack. Docherty, the left-centre, kicked over to the left. Weatherstone forced himself over for a try. It was not converted. Scotland were still two points behind. Undoubtedly, the Wallabies were now playing the best football of their tour. J.E. Thornett scores their second try.

The Australians now scented victory. They already had a reputation for robust play; now they were showing skill as well. But they were penalised. A.R. Smith kicked a beautiful goal for Scotland. At half-time, Scotland Six, Australia Eight. Scotland were awarded another penalty soon after the resumption. A.R. Smith scored again. Scotland led, Nine-Eight.

If the game so far had been robust it now produced enough vigour to satisfy anyone. But there was no deliberately foul play. Only one point separated the teams. This was suspense such as even Murrayfield rarely sees.

The Scots put all they had behind their determination to score again, but they seemed to be up against a brick wall. No quarter was asked or given. Finally in the last minutes of the game, Scotland scored the winning try. Chisholm managed to pass to G.B. Stevenson who got over the line. Scotland had won twelve points to eight.
