IMAUGURATION OF PLORENCE'S BRIDGE ST. TRINITA

The history of the most famous bridge of Florence is very ancient. It was first built up in the year 1269 by Dominican friend. It was then reconstructed in 1346 by Taddeo Gaddi.

- In 1557 the bridge was turned down by a fleed of the river Arno. Cosimo I of Medici encharged sculpters Ammannati and Michelangelo to rebuild it up, and in 1569 the work was ever. In addition to it, Cosimo I of Medici had some statues drawn at public park and set ever the balustrade of the bridges the most femous of these statues was "The Springtime" by sculptor Caccini.
- After 387 years, on August 3rd 1944 Florence's bridge St. Trinita blew up by mines laid, by Nazi units on their retreat to prevent Allies from ossessing the Arno.

after the war, Engineer Brizzi and Architect Chisdulach were encharged to re-build the bridge exactly like it was before. At this point a werm polemic raised among the Florentines: the "Springtime" had been recovered from the river, but not its head, so that the status has been replaced over the bridge thus mutilated. Florentimes are thereafter divided into two partiess one is inclined for leaving the statue as it is now, and amother for having a new head like the one lost made over; this latter is the majority, as architects and Florence's authorities lean for the first party.

Anyway posterday the new bridge, rebuilt after the original, was insugurated at the presence of Premier Zeli, of Minister of Public Works, and of many politics and art officials.

This work cost 300 million live of which a fifth has been effered by Florence's citizens.
