## POLAR REPORS ARRIVE:

Her Majesty's New Zealand Ship "Endeavour" docks at Wellington, where a big welcome awaits the members of the Commonwealth Trans-Antaretic Expedition - Sir Edmind Millary, Dr. Vivian Fuchs and their colleagues. Their families are on the quayaide to greet the first men to reach the South Pole by land since Scott and Assundeen.

Mrs. Fuchs and Lady Millary wait side by side - and their husbands are the first down the gangplank. This is really a triple welcome; New Zeeland is greeting its own party, so brilliantly led by Sir Edmund Millary, conqueror of Everest; the United Kingdom's party (whose courageous journey across under Dr. soon to be Sir Vivian Puchs across the entire width of the Antaretic Continent held the world spellbound. The company of "Endeavour" who have done a tremendous amount of invaluable scientific work on their own account, complementing that of Puchs and his teem, and Millary and the New Zeelanders.

Some small but important explorers have to stay on board while Wellington gives a civic reception to the Polar Heroes at the City Hall; the Mayer of Wellington, Mr. Prank J. Kitts, M.P., presiding. The city's welcome is of the kind usually reserved for reyal tours; for New Zealand feels the double honour of having contributed to the expedition in men and money (Wellington citisens alone donated £12000 in one week) and of being the first esuntry to welcome back the men who achieved this historie triumph.
