

PARAPLECIC CENTRE.

Near the sea at Portheawl is the Portheawl Rest
Convalescent Home - one of the few voluntary enganisations of
its kind left in the country. The Home includes a Paraplegia
Centre; and to improve its service, a new extension to the Centre
is being opened by Mr. W.H. Cowws, J.P., General Secretary of
the South Wales Area of the National Union of Mineworkers. For
this is above all a service vital to the mining community. With
their wives and children, paraplegic miners like Mr. Hartnell
here - (injured at Cum Gorse celliery in 1954) receive the car
they deserve. Mr. Bates had his accident in Groesfasm in 1951.

Persphegic Section is the only one in Great Britain which will be able to provide convalescent treatment and halidays for about eleven paraplegies and their families every week. A disabled miner has earned the community's help; and since looking after him is a whole time job, his wife, too, deserves a rest now and them - while someone else does the werrying for a change. That's a service the Porthoswl Centre is provid and happy to give.
