

ROYAL TOUR OF SCOTLAND:

The Royal Yacht Britannia docks at Leith, bringing the Queen and Prince Philip on their visit to Edinburgh. Lord Provost Mr. Johnson-Gilbert greets them on the quayside, to extend to them Edinburgh's Official welcome - and to offer Her Majesty the keys of the city. Early on the Duke's programme is a visit to Parramore House, where the Duke of Hamilton, President of Canongate Boys' Club, escorts him past an interested audience. During his visit, Prince Philip unveils the Club's War Memorial.

Ex-head-boy Mr. Pringle Fisher presents a history of the Club, Loretto School is also honoured by a royal visit - the Headmaster, Mr. Forbes Mackintosh, escorting the Queen.

The boys of Loretto School pride themselves on their Highland dancing - and they put on a display for the Queen and Prince Philip.

Prince Philip is patron of the Queen Victoria School at Dunblane, and on their Jubilee Grand Day he inspects the School on parade - with a very soldierly young man leading the way.

After the inspection, Prince Philip presents some prizes -and as usual, he turns it into more than a mere formal ceremony.

Among the spectators are old boys who joined the school when it was founded just half a century ago. Like them, the boys of today are all sons of Scottish sailors, soldiers and airmen - and in turn, the school has produced many men who have distinguished themselves in all three services. A proud record for a fiftieth birthday.
