Subject **NAUTILUS**

The atomic powered submarine nautilus made history this week when she sailed under the arctic ice cap. Rear Admiral Hyman Rickover the father of the atomic sub, inspects the nautilus before she took off on her voyage from the Pacific to the Atlantic under the North Pole. The nautilus submerged at Point Barrow, Alaska, and surfaced four days later in the Atlantic between Spitsbergen and Greenland. During the voyage the one hundred sixteen crewmen and scientific observers aboard had all the comforts of home. The unprecedented eighteen hundred mile voyage has opened up a new and shorter route between the Pacific and the Atlantic and Europe. In addition to the military possibilities seen by the first underseas voyage under the top of the world the trip also added valuable scientific knowledge of the sub surface of the arctic basin. It has opened up the possibility of the use of the polar route by nuclear powered subs as a new commercial seaway between the two oceans. In a military sense the important development in the voyage shows the Arctic can be used to guide missiles from subs.
