

TRAIN PLUNGES INTO BAY.

Precariously from Newark Bay drawbridge hung one coach of a New Jersey suburban train. Two diesel locomotives and two coaches were under water. Forty people were killed, 33 injured. To the scene of the appalling accident a motor boat took a clergyman, for bodies were still being recovered.

Speeding commuters to their daily work in New York, the train failed to stop at the open drawbridge, plunging 50 feet into water 40 feet deep. Normally automatic mechanism stops trains when the bridge is open. How it failed to work this time is not yet known. Some passengers escaped by breaking windows open. Others were too dazed to remember how they got out.

A few hours after the accident the hanging coach dropped into the water. All America is deeply shocked by this unique and terrible accident.
